Planned Parenthood of the Inland Northwest, headquartered in Spokane, Washington, but also responsible for the nine northern counties of Idaho, has been active in Idaho for six years. PPINW believes that no child should be unwanted or unloved and, in keeping with that part of our mission statement, we furnish a wide range of services to women and their families in the Inland Northwest including, but not limited to, gynecological exams, birth control counseling and supplies, colposcopy, vasectomy, pregnancy testing, anonymous HIV testing, reproductive options counseling, emergency contraception pills, medical and surgical abortion services, sexually transmitted infection testing and treatment, mid-life wellness exams, and breast and testicular cancer screening and referrals.

The agency does not at this time operate a clinic in northern Idaho but women from the nine northern counties are invited to call a toll free Idaho number (206-762-8099) for referral to one of our eastern Washington offices. PPINW serves clients utilizing a sliding payment scale whereby individuals in need can obtain needed medical services regardless of their ability to pay.

EARLY HEAD START

Mountain States Early Head Start is a free child development/home visiting program serving income-eligible families with children from birth through age three, and pregnant women, in the Coeur d'Alene and Sandpoint areas. Our program is parent-driven, involving families in every aspect of operations, from designing the home visiting agenda to program governance and parent committees. We believe parents are their child's best teachers and encourage them to become advocates of their children's learning and development. At the same time, children build a healthy attachment with their parents and will grow and develop in safe and nurturing environments.

While our Family Consultants support parents' interactions with their children, other areas of our program allow parents to develop leadership skills and a sense of accomplishment that will help them in other aspects of their lives and encourage them to increase their participation in other community activities. Because our program is funded through a federal grant we depend largely on our parent involvement to meet our in-kind match of that grant. Every time parents spend time with their children, joining them in their play or reading books together, or participate in program events, they "donate" valuable time back to our program which, in turn, counts toward our in-kind match.
